BOTTOM LINE:

Great leaders know that leadership is not limited to the marketplace; leadership begins at home.

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- When it comes to parenting, emphasize honor over obedience.
 - o In an environment where there's no honor, you have to cover every possibility with a rule, which can be exhausting.
 - o Look for ways to focus on honoring relationships rather than keeping a list of rules.
 - Children learn how to defend the honor of others when they see you defending the honor of someone else.

• Lying breaks a relationship.

- o Nothing matters if you can't believe what you hear.
- o Lying throws everything off balance.

• Discipline toward relationships rather than obedience.

- o Discipline in the direction of who they dishonored.
- O Discipline in a way that teaches your children how to re-establish the relationship with whoever they dishonored.
- Restoring a relationship is a life skill children have to learn. This is not something they naturally know how to do, so it is up to you to teach them.

Resist pre-assigning a consequence to a behavior.

- o Honor says, "I expect the best from you, so I don't need to threaten you."
- o Look shocked when kids are dishonoring or disobedient.
- o Instead of quickly handing out a punishment, give yourself time to think of a creative way to help restore the relationship that was broken.

· Love your kids on your calendar, not just in your hearts.

- o Small, consistent deposits make a big difference in your children's lives.
- o Decide what's most important and put that on your calendar first.
- o Your greatest contribution to the world may not be something you do, but someone you raise.
